

OUTCOMES MATTER



Mr. James "Harold" Spivey was admitted to Pecan Bayou Nursing and Rehab on March 1st, 2024, following a stay in the hospital for pneumonia. He presented with a significant decrease in strength, decreased endurance, and a new onset difficulty with swallowing. During his stay at Pecan Bayou, he received Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy.

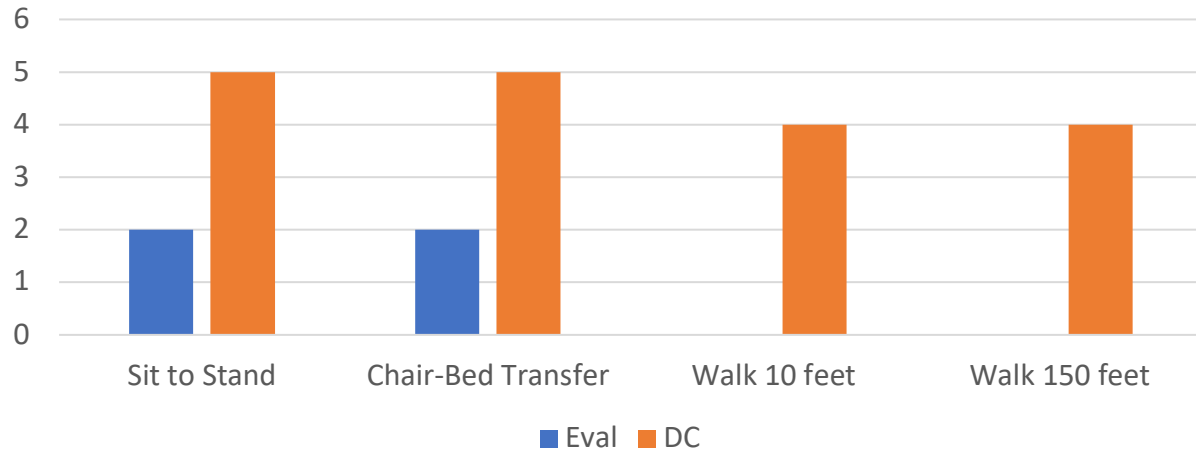
PT focused on improving bed mobility, transfers, lower extremity strength, and eventually gait. OT focused on improving toileting, dressing, and hygiene/grooming tasks. ST focused on restoring swallowing function with patient/caregiver training to improve safety.

Initially Mr. Spivey did not walk and had difficulty with transfers. He required significant assistance to transition from bed to wheelchair. He also required significant assistance with toileting and dressing.

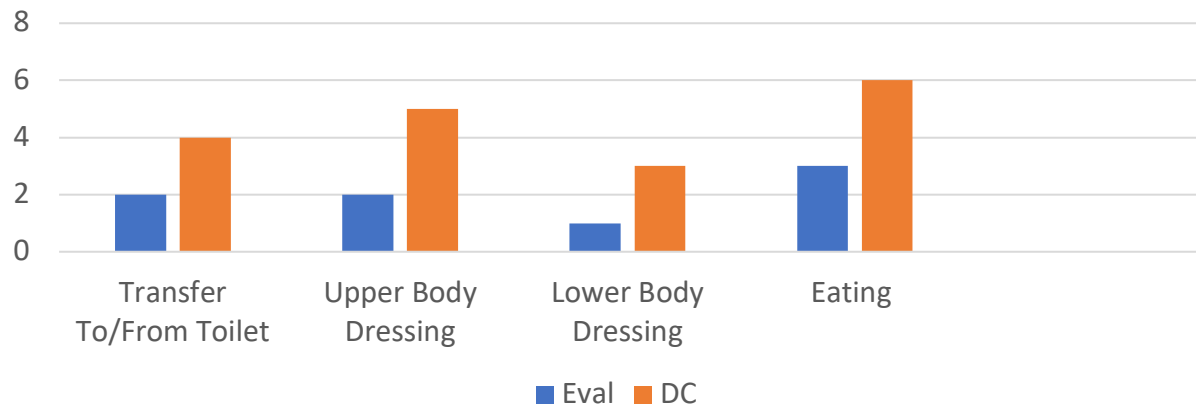
As he participated in therapy, he began to show progress with transfers and overall strength. He started to stand and walk more with improved endurance. Dressing and toileting also showed progress. He progressed well with swallowing and eventually only needed occasional cueing to ensure proper techniques.

Mr. Spivey made great progress with therapy while at Pecan Bayou and only needed someone beside him during most tasks. He was able to discharge home with family/caregiver support on May 10th, 2024.

MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05 - Setup or clean-up assistance Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
